From the Rabbi's Desk

Dear congregants,

hen I graduated from Fairleigh Dickinson University in 2007, I was one of only a few lews in that year's matriculating class. The student speaker that day was not Jewish, but what she said was a credit to lews everywhere. Growing up, she stated, she'd never met a lewish person, yet she'd been raised to hate the people of that faith. When she finally left home to attend college, she met us few Jews on campus and discovered that we were nice people, and not at all like the perpetrated stereotype she had learned to detest as a child.

e'd do right to ask ourselves, why do certain individuals persist in hating and vilifying people that they don't even know, who pose no real threat to them? In answer,



the well-known scholar Umberto Eco suggests that human beings need enemies.

hrough their jealousy and paranoia, they elevate their own ego, and solidify their identities. Whether it be towards lews or any other minority group, their hatred gives them the illusion of strength as they tear others down. What they don't realize is that by poisoning their lives with animosity they're actually undermining their own humanity. These individuals lose sight of common decency and instead engage in bigotry, even if the minority they

evangelize against have never offended them personally.

f only these misinformed zealots could replace their hatred with empathy, by imagining what it may be like to live as the victims they speak out against. Eradicating this blind hatred and replacing vitriol with love is an essential movement that we all should be a part of. For if we don't advocate for optimism, altruism and respect towards humankind, the hatred they the lews are withstanding currently could spread to other minority groups and overtake the entire world. We must combat the ugliness we see pervading both in the United States and countries abroad and encourage our fellow citizens to unite in positive acts of acceptance and lovingkindness. Let's

Message from the President

Now that we are in the 8th month (February) of our 2023-2024 Fiscal Year I thought it would be appropriate to bring everyone up to date on what has been happening at our Congregation. Much has been accomplished but more still needs to be done.

ffice: Our new Office Assistant, Cristina Velazquez, started working on July 10, 2023. She is a wonderful addition to our "family" and appears to be adjusting well to our pace and foibles. Many of you have already been introduced to her and have worked with her on several different member issues. Besides working on everyday issues and projects, Cristina has been concentrating on helping to implement the many office automation changes that are taking place. She has become

our expert printer of all our pamphlets and booklets, and has become proficient in navigating and understanding our Share-Point applications. She has begun the process of updating and organizing all our paper files and procedural books. Due to her efforts and hard work the office operations are more efficient, productive, and therefore cost effective. Nina has provided invaluable assistance to Cristina in this endeavor.

D ownstairs Area: The cleaning and organization of the downstairs rooms and closets have basically been completed. A great deal has been accomplished – we continue to utilize the three classrooms for our Hebrew School classes. We have begun to speak to contractors regarding an upgraded design of our classrooms, one classroom at a time. Once upgraded we intend to replace the furniture in each room. Sisterhood's Book Discussion Group met on Sunday, January 21, 2024 to discuss the novel "Karolina's Twins" by Ronald Balson.


We met on Zoom because of problems with winter weather. A lively discussion was held by all who attended.

Bikur Cholim News

Bikur cholim (also transliterated **bikur holim**) refers to the mitzvah (lewish religious commandment) to visit and extend aid to the sick. It is considered an aspect of gemilut chasadim (benevolence, selflessness, loving-kindness). It is traditional to recite prayers for healing, such as the Mi Shebeirach prayer in the synagogue, and Psalms on behalf of the sick. Bikur holim societies exist in lewish communities around the world. The earliest bikur holim society on record dates back to the early Middle Ages. The roots of bikur holim can be traced back to the Torah, when G-d visits Abraham after his circumcision (Genesis 18:1).



Here at Congregation Beth Tikvah our committee strives to keep in touch with members who are ill or even just need to have their day brightened a bit. We send cards, make phone calls, visit and may provide a drive to an appointment or assist with
