Message from the President

n preparation for our Purim Ball, I started to peruse my informational documents on Purim and found the following very interesting and informative five-year-old article from the Chabad of Mineola entitled **JUST WON THE PURIM** LOTTERY! The Purim Lottery

he month of Adar is upon us, and the holiday of Purim is just around the corner. The word Purim means lottery (the Feast of Lots). The wicked Haman made a lottery to choose a random date to destroy the lews—and as it happens, the date fell out on the month in which Moses was born. Haman knew

that Moses, the redeemer of the Jews, had passed away on the seventh day of the month of Adar. So. when the lottery fell on the seventh of Adar, Ham- each pairing. an rejoiced. But Haman didn't know that Moses was also born on the seventh of Adar!

ur history tells us that there was another lottery where everyone was a winner. What a lot in life. The match is was the procedure for the divinely ordained. division of the Holy Land apportioned to the 12 tribes? Then, pairs of lots—one from each box—were drawn. A Temple priest was there to prophesy

similar lottery is administered to the soul before leaving heaven and coming down to this world. Each soul is paired with a particular "parcel of land," a unique destiny, Sometimes (particularly when we hit the rough spots in our lives) we may lose faith in the lottery's divine accuracy. We must be reminded that our soul is on a divine mission with a unique destiny to fulfill—to settle and develop a particular "parcel of land" with acts of goodness and kindness. 

Bikur Cholim Committee News

Bikur cholim (also transliterated bikur holim) refers to the mitzvah (Jewish religious commandment) to visit and extend aid to the sick. It is considered an aspect of gemilut chasadim (benevolence, selflessness, lovingkindness). It is traditional to recite prayers for healing, such as the Mi_Shebeirach prayer in the synagogue, and Psalms on behalf of the sick.

Bikur holim societies exist in Jewish communities around the world. The earliest bikur holim society on record dates back to the early Middle Ages. The roots of bikur holim can be traced back to the Torah, when G-d visits Abraham after his circumcision (Genesis 18:1).

Here at Congregation Beth Tikvah our committee strives to keep in touch with members who are ill or even just need to have their day brightened a bit. We send cards, make phone calls, visit and may provide a drive to an appointment or assist with an occasional shopping trip.

Everything But the Hamentashen

Rabbi Weisblum and Morah Dahlia gave a brief introduction to the Hebrew School children about the custom of giving Shalach Manot packages to people on Purim. Morah Dahlia told about how important it is especially for the soldiers because they are separated from their family and friends. Cookie Cohen briefly told how she read that in Israel, children always do this mitzvah for soldiers.

An assembly line was set up and the children each filled two or three bags with goodies for the soldiers. When that was done,



Len provided them with Purim notes where they could write short greetings and draw pictures, and these were also put into the bags.

When the project was completed, Len asked if anyone knew what was missing. Many of the children knew the answer. Hamentashen! He explained that unlike the treats they packed, hamentashen would not "travel" well to Israel, and arrangements are in place for them to be added in Israel before the bags are distributed to the soldiers.

Even for the youngest, it's important to give them a hands-on opportunity to do this important mitzvah connecting them to both a beautiful Purim custom and to the soldiers of the IDF who are defending the State of Israel.




