I stretched my legs as much as my seat accommodation allowed me to and took a look around me. It seemed out of the ordinary to not have any children on the plane.

fter a short rest, I was invited to join a minyan by a couple of young men. They approached others cheerfully and gathered more people. We prayed for the hostages to return safely to their family, for peace in Israel, and for world peace. Following the prayers we engaged in a conversation. I was amazed to find out that most people were on a business trip rather than leisure. A few of them pointed out that on this trip they will spend less time than they generally do, as their family didn't join the trip. The flight was pleasant, and I



looked forward to seeing my family members.

Some of my friends who haven't spoken to their family members for years, had tearful reunion. Message from the President

s we started to prepare for this year's Jewish Holidays, I once again asked myself, perhaps the age- old question of, Why are Jewish holidays, and their celebrations important?

n order to answer this question, as I seem to do every year, I began by pondering what, in a general sense, the holidays are celebrating. Let's consider, for now, just the major holidays, where-by "major" I mean the holidays most familiar to, and celebrated by, many lewish communities. These include Rosh Hashanah. Yom Kippur, Sukkot, Simchat Torah, Hanukkah, Passover, Shavuot. The start of each lewish year -Rosh Hashanah - always occurs in autumn. Sukkot, short periods which, least in part, connected to to our lives. In the modthe idea of harvesting crops.

major holiday A which emerged after the Biblical period is Simchat Torah, which celebrates the inflection point in the annual Torah reading cycle, when one reading is finished, the Torah scrolls are rewound, and the reading begins anew.

hus, it becomes evident that the Torah forces us to remember that our lives must have dedicated times when we focus on the things that give life a meaning. The lewish calendar is a structure of shared time. We mark the start of each year which, in relation to a human lifetime, is a relatively long unit of time. We also mark seasons within the year, relatively Pesach and Shavuot are, at nonetheless, add a rhythm ern era it is, perhaps, easy to lose this sense of rhythm, but in the past,

agricultural cycles were important interval markers which everyone would have been aware of. So. I found that one clear theme emerges as to why we celebrate holidays: marking the passage of **time**. In essence then we can say that holidays serve as markers of time. What else?

onsider, for example, Passover, Purim and Chanukah, these holidays encourage us to ponder key events in the history of the lews. The Exodus from Egypt. The saving of the Jews of Persia by Esther. The Maccabean revolt against the Greek Seleucid Army in order to re-take control of the Temple. And a more modern holiday which may become part of the lewish holiday canon is Holocaust Memorial Day. All of these stories point to another important theme: remember







Bikur Cholim Committee News

Bikur cholim (also transliterated bikur holim) refers to the mitzvah (lewish religious commandment) to visit and extend aid to the sick. It is considered an aspect of gemilut chasadim (benevolence, selflessness, loving-kindness). It is traditional to recite prayers for healing, such as the Mi Shebeirach prayer in the synagogue, and Psalms on behalf of the sick. Bikur holim societies exist in lewish communities around the world. The earliest bikur holim society on record dates back to the early Middle Ages. The roots of bikur holim can be traced back to the Torah, when G-d visits Abraham after his circumcision (Genesis 18:1).




