From the Rabbi's Desk

Dear Congregants,

R osh Hashana, the Jewish New Year is behind us, and we are looking forward to celebrating the joyous holiday of Hanukkah -The Jewish festival of lights. The beginning of the fiscal calendar year is fast approaching as well.

his is the time in which we reflect on our last year's resolutions and expectations. e carefully evaluate the outcome of our determinations and vow to make this list more realistic this time around.

here is a strong

correlation between expectations and disappointments. The greater the expectation so is the disappointment that follows by not meeting the said goal. It is crucial to accept our failures with love just as we do our successes. The key to eliminating regrets, is to be realistic in the goals that we set for ourselves and to avoid trying to control the issues that are beyond our control.

T ransparency and accountability are valuable virtues that we often demand from others either in a relationship or in business. We seldom ask the



It was very well attended and a lively discussion was held. This powerful, sweeping book about a courageous woman in World War 2 Germany gave us a great deal to talk about.





Bikur Cholim Committee News

Bikur cholim (also transliterated **bikur ho**lim) refers to the mitzvah (lewish religious commandment) to visit and extend aid to the sick. It is considered an aspect of gemilut chasadim (benevolence, selflessness, loving-kindness). It is traditional to recite prayers for healing, such as the Mi Shebeirach prayer in the synagogue, and Psalms on behalf of the sick. Bikur holim societies exist in lewish communities around the world. The earliest bikur holim society on record dates to the early Middle Ages. The roots of bikur holim can be traced back to the Torah, when G-d visits Abraham after his circumcision (Genesis

18:1).

Here at Congregation Beth Tikvah our committee strives to keep in touch with members who are ill or even just need to have their day brightened a bit. We send cards, make phone calls, visit and may even provide a drive to an appointment or assist with occasional shopping.






