From the Rabbi's Desk

Dear Congregants,

ast month, our hearts were stirred with profound emotion and gratitude as we learned of the release of Idan Alexander from captivity in Gaza. For so many of us, Idan is not just a name, we see our own sons, brothers, neighbors, and students in him. His story, marked by pain but now illuminated by hope, has echoed across the Jewish world and reminded us of what binds us together: love, faith, and an unbreakable sense of mutual responsibility. Idan's return is more than a personal reunion, it is a sacred symbol of the Jewish soul's resilience. It reminds us that even in the darkest of times, we do not give up on one another. We pray. We advocate. We cry. We act. And we hold each other up.

s we approach Shavuot, the festival when we stood together at Sinai to receive the Torah, we are reminded of what it means to be one people. The Torah was not given to individuals, but to a united nation, standing "as one person with one heart." That is the same spirit that led to Idan's freedom. And it is the same spirit we must carry forward, for those still waiting to come home, and for a world that so desperately needs the light of



compassion and justice.

This season also brings us the story of Ruth, a woman who chose to join our people not out of obligation, but out of love. Her journey into the heart of our people mirrors what we strive to offer each other: belonging, kindness, and unwavering support. Ruth's example is a timeless call to open our arms wider, to draw closer to one another, and to never take for granted the sacred gift of community.

e live in a time when the Jewish people are being tested, spiritually, emotionally, and globally. But this is also a time when we are witnessing extraordinary strength. We are witnessing young people stepping up, communities uniting, and a powerful resurgence of Jewish pride and purpose. So I ask you: as we prepare to receive the Torah again this

Shavuot, what does it mean to stand at Sinai today? How can we live the words Na'aseh v'nishma, "We will do and we will listen", with our full hearts?

erhaps it means joining together to recite Tehillim (Psalms) for those still in captivity. Perhaps it means reaching out to someone in pain or attending a community learning night in honor of Shavuot. Perhaps it means sending a donation, making a call, or simply showing up. Each of us has something to give. Idan's release is not the end of the story. It is a beginning, a reminder that we are stronger together, that our voices matter, and that every soul is infinitely precious. May his healing be complete, and may his courage inspire us to act with even greater love and unity.

This Shavuot, may we stand together, bound not only by history, but by hope. Not only by tradition, but by action. And not only by words, but by the deeds that define us as a holy people.

2025/2026 Budget Update

At the congregation meeting that was held on May 18th 2025 the proposed budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026 was presented. The budget was voted on and passed by the congregation. Highlights are as follows:

Membership Dues will **not be increased**. Some examples of the rates are:

Full Family \$2,075 Senior Family \$1,349 Single \$1,038

Religious School Tuition fees will be eliminated

Each member unit (except Alumni who live outside of the area, usually Florida and North Carolina, Virginia) will continue to be charged a mandatory \$125 Security fee (increased by 25.00) that must be paid by June 30th 2026. This fee will be used to cover the cost for Security Guard(s). Some examples of activities where Security Guards will be needed are:

Friday night services

Saturday morning services

Hebrew School

Hanukkah Party

Purim Party Festival

Holiday Services - Shavuot, Sukkot, Simchat Torah, Purim, Passover. Security for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are covered under the High Holiday expense line

Community Seder

Mandatory participation in the Fundraising Gift Certificate program <u>will</u> <u>continue</u> with required purchase amounts unchanged from this year.


These reflections are short and easy to read. It should be interesting to discuss some of them.

Bikur Cholim Committee News

Bikur cholim (also transliterated bikur holim) refers to the mitzvah (lewish religious commandment) to visit and extend aid to the sick. It is considered an aspect of gemilut chasadim (benevolence, selflessness, loving-kindness). It is traditional to recite prayers for healing, such as the Mi Shebeirach prayer in the synagogue, and Psalms on behalf of the sick.

Bikur holim societies exist in Jewish communities around the world. The earliest bikur holim society on record dates to the early Middle Ages. The roots of bikur holim can be traced back to the Torah, when G-d visits

Abraham after his circumcision (Genesis 18:1).

Here at Congregation Beth Tikvah our committee strives to keep in touch with members who are ill or even just need to have their day brightened a bit. We send cards, make phone calls, visit and may even provide a drive to an appointment or assist with occasional shopping.




