Message from the Co-Presidents

s November approaches, both Jer-A ry and I began to think about this year's uplifting and enjoyable religious services and want to take a moment to reflect on the profound journey also moments of learning. What did we we've shared over the past several weeks The High Holidays have drawn to a close leaving us spiritually renewed and deeply connected. From solemn introspection from Yom Kippur to the celebration of Simchat Torah our community came together in prayer, song and unity. We are deeply grateful to everyone who volunteered and helped make the sacred days meaningful and memorable.

his holiday coincided with the momentous development in Israel that stirred emotions across the world. On October 13th, Israel released nearly 2,000 Palestinian prisoners as a ceasefire agreement brokered by Egypt and Qatar. The exchange followed the release of the final 20 living Israeli hostages held in Gaza. While the political and humanitarian implications of this exchange are complex, it reminds us of the enduring hope for peace and the sacred value of human life.

s we reflect on this past Holi-A day Season, we ask ourselves: What have We Learned from This Year's High Holy Day Services

As a congregation, we entered this year's High Holy Days with open hearts and searching spirits. The services we

shared — from the first notes of the shofar on Rosh Hashanah to the final dance with the Torah on Simchat Torah — were not only moments of ritual, but discover together?

The Power of Presence

This year's services reminded us that showing up matters. Whether in the sanctuary, online, or in spirit, our presence created a sacred energy. We learned that prayer is not only about words on a page, but about the collective heartbeat of a community gathered with intention.

The Language of Music

The melodies of the High Holy Days carried us through awe, repentance, and joy. We learned that music could reach places words cannot - stirring memories, softening hearts, and binding us together across generations. The familiar tunes reminded us of continuity, while new interpretations opened us to fresh meaning.

How wonderful to see the children on the stage singing with the Rabbi and Cantor, blowing the small torahs and happily accepting their goody bag and watching them dance around the sanctuary with the torahs on Simcha Torah.



reflections, we discovered that ancient words still speak to modern lives. We learned that the themes of teshuvah (return), forgiveness, and renewal are not abstract ideas, but practical tools for navigating today's challenges — from personal struggles to global concerns.

The Strength of Community

Standing shoulder to shoulder, reciting confessions in the plural, we learned again that Judaism is never a solitary path. Our services taught us that responsibility is shared, healing is communal, and joy is magnified when celebrated together.

The Gift of Reflection

Perhaps most importantly, the services gave us timetime to pause, to breathe, to ask hard questions of ourselves. We learned that reflection is not a luxury, but a necessity. In a world that moves quickly, the High Holy Days slowed us down long enough to hear the still, small voice within.

Carrying the Lessons Forward

Now, as we move deeper into the year, the challenge is to carry these lessons beyond the sanctuary. To keep showing up. To let music and tradition guide

us. To lean on one another. To make space for reflection.

I f the High Holy Days are the spiritual reset of our year, then our task is to live out their teachings in the ordinary days that follow. May we continue to learn, to grow, and to walk this path together.

As a synagogue community we hold Israel close to our hearts. We pray for the safety of all its citizens and tor the healing of those affected by war and captivity.

The High Holy days are behind us and Hanukkah is just around the corner. It's a quieter time yet deeply meaningful. It's a chance to carry forward the intentions we set during Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot and Simchat Torah and prepare our hearts for the lights of Hannukah.



The BIKUR CHOLIM **COMMITTEE** is looking for blank greeting cards that you would like to donate. These cards are used to send speedy recovery and good wishes to those who are sick and recovering from an illness. Please bring any cards you have to the office. Thank you.

Bikur cholim (also transliterated bikur holim) refers to the mitzvah (lewish religious commandment) to visit and extend aid to the sick. It is considered an aspect of tion of one pint of gemilut chasadim (benevolence, selflessness, loving-kindness). It is traditional to recite prayers for healing, such as the Mi Shebeirach prayer in the synagogue, and Psalms on behalf of the sick. The earliest bikur holim socie- ture notices about this ty on record dates to the early Middle Ages. The roots of bikur holim can be traced back to the Torah, when G-d visits Abraham after his circumcision (Genesis 18:1).

Here at Congregation Beth Tikvah our committee strives to keep in touch with members who

are ill or even just need to have their day brightened a bit. We send cards, make phone calls, visit and may even provide a drive to an appointment or assist with occasional shopping.
